






















# Know the signs

Have you ever noticed that safety signs come in different colours? See below and learn why some signs are **BLUE**, some are **RED**, some are **GREEN** and some are **YELLOW**!

Shape and Colour	Meaning	Example on the farm
 <p><b>Circle with a diagonal bar</b> <b>Red</b> - White contrast</p>	<p><b>Prohibition</b> This means you cannot do something! (no, stop, do not go)</p>	<p>Children do not cross  Do not Enter </p>
 <p><b>Blue circle</b> Blue - White contrast</p>	<p><b>Mandatory</b> This means you must or you have to do it! It can be something you have to wear or something you have to do!</p>	<p>  Wash your hands   Eye protection   Ear protection   Disinfect Boots   A hard hat         </p>
 <p><b>Triangle</b> Yellow - Black contrast</p>	<p><b>Caution / Warning</b> This is warning you of something that could be dangerous and to take care! Be careful, watch out and stay back!</p>	<p>  Beware of Bull   Cattle Crossing   Electricity   Deep Water   Poison   Tractor crossing         </p>
 <p><b>Square / Rectangle</b> <b>Green</b> - White contrast</p>	<p><b>A Safe area</b> Eg. Emergency exit or Assembly point</p>	<p>  Assembly point   Emergency exit door              Safe area to assemble         </p>
 <p><b>Square / Rectangle</b> <b>Red</b> - White contrast</p>	<p><b>Location of fire fighting equipment.</b></p>	<p>  Fire Extinguisher         </p>

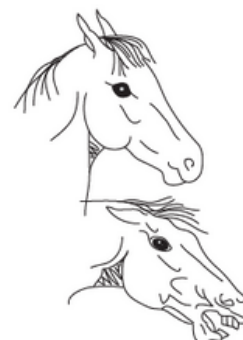

you are in!**



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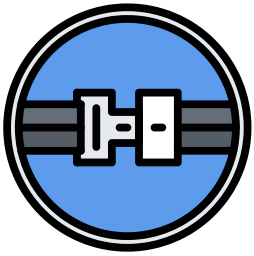
